Match the empty cross to the full cross of the same color by drawing a line.

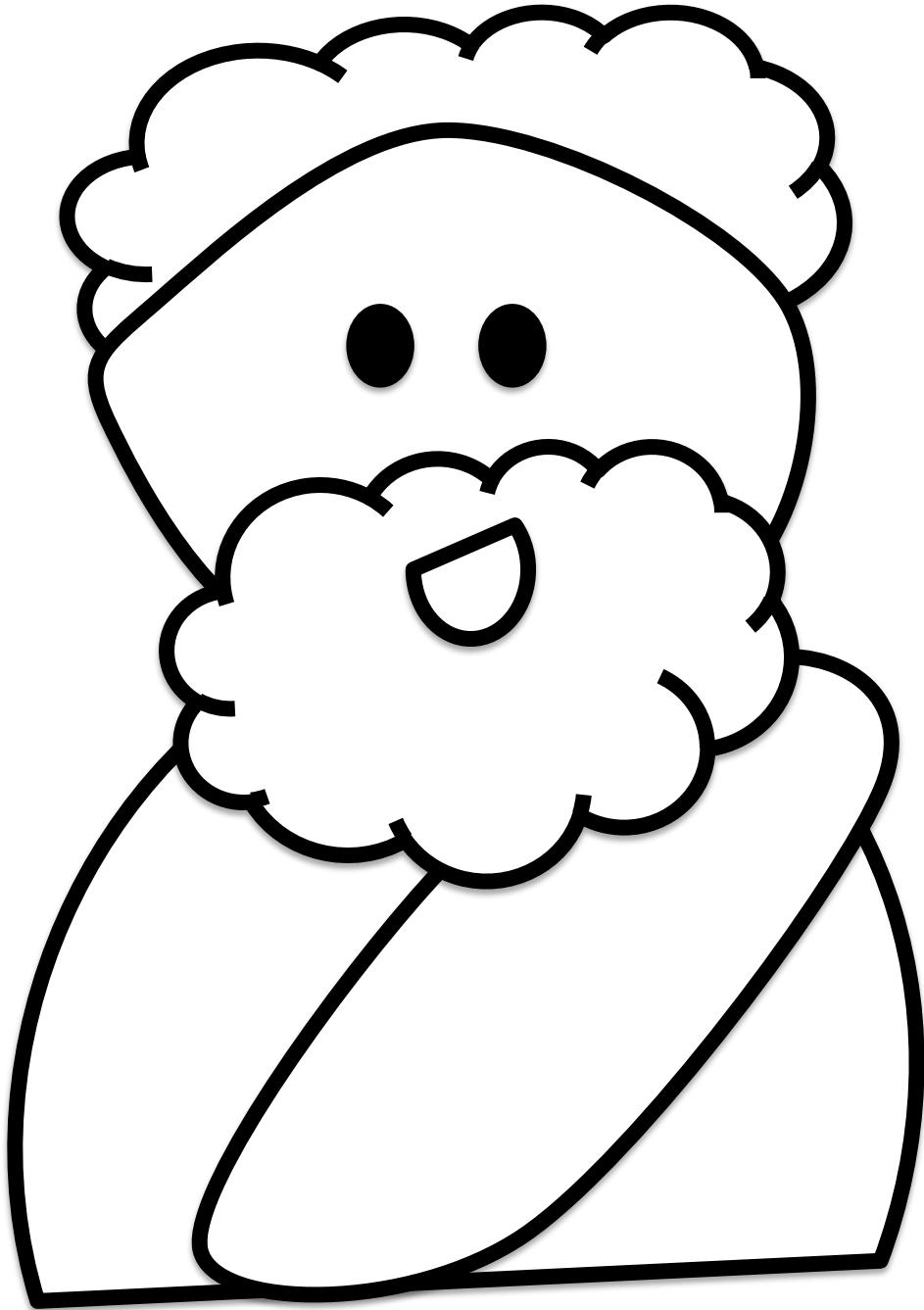
